Oxford Diocesan Guild of Church Bell Ringers, Group Personal Accident Insurance

For a number of years, the Guild has arranged Group Personal Accident Insurance cover for Guild members and those under instruction by a Guild member. In May 2009, the benefits were increased and the lower and upper age limits on cover were removed.

Scope of coverage

Guild members are covered whilst ringing or attending to routine maintenance work to the bells in any church or bell tower, or whilst travelling to or from a church or bell tower to practice or take part in bell ringing anywhere in the United Kingdom. ("Routine maintenance" means any works for which approval in accordance with the Care of Churches Measure is not required - separate cover can be arranged where needed in connection with these more major items of work).

Insurance is extended to include members teaching bell ringing and persons under instruction by a Guild member at a church or bell tower within the Diocese of Oxford.

MASTER'S REPORT

In the last months of 2019, the breath of contagion came silently, stealthily from afar, like the scourging angel of the 14th century Black Death, it spread relentlessly throughout the globe bringing death and a new kind of destruction to us all. At first, we were unaware that so much of our 21st century lifestyle would be changed irrevocably, and our bells would be silenced for so many months, much to the anguish of our ringers and adding to the misery of the communities that we serve.

Even in wartime it was possible to ring silenced bells and, more significantly, to socialise and enjoy one another's company, to share a pint, or a ringers' tea and to demonstrate support and affection by a handshake, a hug or a cheerful chuckle and a slap on the back. Now we are wary, cautious of being with other people and we retreat into our own spaces wondering what further restriction the next day will bring and just how much more wreckage this pandemic will leave behind. Although it has been a testing year, ingenious ringers have demonstrated their creativity in so many ways. In numerous churches the congregations have been welcomed to services, actual and online, by handbell ringers; many towers have worked out a way to ring a few bells with small, stalwart bands, distanced, masked and occasionally double-handling; single bells have been tolled to remind neighbours that the Church is active and the bells will not be wholly silenced.

Away from real ropes and real bells, the technology of Ringing Room has gripped aficionados with the zeal of a computer game challenge, bringing a great deal of enjoyment and honing kills for a large number of ringers throughout the world. So too, have handbell ringers profited from their expertise and enthusiasm and rung in gardens, garages, in fact anywhere that enabled Covid Rules to be followed. There have been business Zoom meetings (the Guild AGM benefitted from a far greater attendance than usual, raising a question about the organisation of future AGMs) and casual Zoom meetings, Branch quizzes and bizarre arrangements for other gatherings. There is no doubt that ringers have tried to keep together and engage with one another. It must be recognised that there are also ringers, for a variety of reasons, who have not been able to enjoy any of these activities and therefore found it very isolating and lonely with no service ringing at all and no familiar banter on practice night. These ringers are not forgotten, we must collectively ensure that we reach out to them as soon as we can and bring them back into the towers.

During the year we have marked the death of two Guild Officers: Derek Fowles and John White.

Derek Fowles was born in 1926 and died on 22 March at the splendid age of 93. Derek took a prominent role in Guild activities. Most recently, and for many years, he was a respected Guild Trustee and Managing Trustee of the Restoration Fund. Among his other roles he was secretary of the Oxford Diocesan Bell Fund, ringing master and treasurer of the EBSB Branch and made a substantial contribution to their fund-raising success. His enduring commitment to his tower and the Guild will be greatly missed.

John White was born in 1964 and died on the 5 March 2020. He was a committed Guild member and took an active role at Aston Clinton tower. He was Chiltern Branch Ringing Master, Secretary and Chairman and served as Guild Deputy Master in1995 and 1996. He had an extensive knowledge about the history of bells and bell maintenance and encouraged and maintained high standards of ringing.

I must publicly thank all the officers, and Guild members with responsibilities, who have worked steadfastly to keep up with business duties and communications, we would be in a poorer situation without their knowledge, skills and constant endeavour and the Guild could not function without them.

Our mutual hope is that sometime in 2021 we will be able to return to ringing as we remember it, to enjoy our fellowship and celebrate the magnificence of our bells and so to end this report for the unforgettable year of 2020 here is a quote from John Betjeman, *Church of England thoughts occasioned by hearing the bells of Magdalen Tower from the Botanic Garden Oxford.*

A multiplicity of bells, A changing cadence, rich and deep Swung from those pinnacles on high To fill the trees and flood the sky And rock the sailing clouds to sleep.

HONORARY GENERAL SECRETARY'S REPORT

The year 2020 was unlike any other for the Guild since the Second World War. Until mid-March events took place much as normal including Branch AGMs for those scheduled in that period. Then the Covid-19 pandemic struck. The Guild met up for the March General Committee meeting just before lockdown. Subsequently there was little ringing for the remainder of the year.

The Guild AGM was held at the end of May two weeks later than originally scheduled. However, because of Government lockdown we could not meet at Blewbury as had been arranged but instead a virtual online meeting was organised based on the Zoom app. We were sorry not to have been able to visit Old North Berks Branch for the AGM particularly in view of the work that they had put into the day and the missed opportunity to see the new ringing stained-glass window at Blewbury. We were one of the very first territorial ringing associations to have an online AGM. The attendance was the highest for many years. Its success was down to the advance planning and the technical knowhow and monitoring provided by Colin Newman and Jonathan Cresshull. After mid-March all business meetings, either Guild or Branch, were held online rather than in person although most branches did hold their AGM during the year.

Also, none of the Guild striking competitions were possible during the year because of the Covid restrictions. Similarly, the cancellation of the national 12-bell and youth competitions led to disappointment for the bands within the diocese who were preparing to participate. Members of the Towers and Belfries Sub-committee and the Education Sub-committee continue to work hard on providing the services that are so useful within the Diocese. The Education Sub-committee has adopted the alternative name of the Learning and Development Working Group reflecting its orientation, although no courses were possible during the year and that will continue into the first half of 2021. Both groups would appreciate more members and offers of assistance, so do come forward if you feel that you can help.

The business of the Guild has continued as usual with General Committee meetings at Tilehurst in March and online in November and the various sub-committees meeting several times during the year. A Public Relations Working Group has also been set up with an initial project to build upon Tim Hayward's work on the website.

Even in a year of little ringing, the work of the Guild continues. I would like to say how much I value the work of all my fellow officers, both at the Guild and at the Branch level. Without them the Guild would not exist.

LEARNING AND DEVELOPMENT WORKING GROUP REPORT 2020 (was Education sub-committee)

The Group has met regularly throughout the year. Once face to face and on the remaining occasions, via Video Conference. The standard business of the group has been transacted at our meetings with an increased focus on what could be delivered under Covid-19 restrictions.

Unfortunately, restrictions prevented us from running any of our practical courses during 2020 but we did manage to hold a 2-part training meeting by way of virtual gatherings. Although there was a terrific amount of output from those gatherings, it has not been possible to act on much of it, although work is progressing to update the Guild Website to enhance the online training services we can provide. In addition, as it is likely that handbell ringing will be possible before tower bells, we have a Handbells sub-Group to look at what development opportunities can be offered going forward.

Amongst the events cancelled in 2020 was Ringing World National Youth Contest in York, at which the ODG team were aiming to defend their title. One of the big challenges following our return to ringing will be the rebuilding of this group as many of the previous group will be too old to take part.

On a more positive note, we have launched the Young Ringers Lockdown Award for our younger members to show off what ringing related things they have been doing during the Covid-19 pandemic. There will be an awards ceremony for this in the Summer of 2021.

Finally, it is fair to say that all members of the group are hoping for much better times, when we can return to proper ringing and start to rebuild the landscape with some quality learning and development opportunities.

TOWERS AND BELFRIES COMMITTEE'S REPORT 2020

The T&B committee met three times including two using Zoom. The June meeting was preparing for advising on "Return to Ringing" inspections. The Zoom attendance has averaged about a dozen which is excellent and certainly higher than using face-to-face meetings. However, the quality of discussion and debate inevitably suffers in "virtual" meetings. There is no plan to change all meetings to Zoom! We are pleased to welcome Philip Dobson to the committee. We now have 14 members, broadly reflecting the geography of the Guild after a lengthy period when some areas had no members nearby.

The scheduled belfry courses at Leckhampstead and Ivinghoe had to be cancelled which is a huge pity as these courses have been so popular. Luckily, the February rope splicing and belfry management course at Radley beat the lockdown by a few weeks and was very well attended and appreciated by students and indeed tutors too. Students enjoyed the wide range of artefacts (pulleys, wheels etc) we used to explain the causes of rope wear and other issues such as rope handling. There is a big demand for rope splicing and we are happy to support local courses with tuition. We want people to come ready to learn skills they can put to good use in their local towers, whether splicing ropes or spotting preventive measures so the rope wear can be reduced and rope life extended.

Besides inspection reports and planning courses, we discussed the general availability of advice and website downloads. This has now widened to the material produced by CCCBR as well as ART, who are producing some excellent downloads with assistance from T&B experts. The CCCBR documents are being reviewed and updated and we are assisting with that. The ODG website has been restructured and we have been updating the T&B page and adding material.

Committee members have been active during the year, within lockdown constraints, with TMA (Tower Maintenance Award), grant inspections and general advice at the following places: Wendover (accessibility), West Challow (ropes), Stoke Goldington, Lambourn (Bell Fund grant inspection), Arborfield, Penn, Winkfield, Slapton, Fulmer, Combe (guide frame), Letcombe Regis (tenor bell), North Stoke (inspection), Weston on the Green (minor improvements), Letcombe Bassett (Bell Fund grant inspection), Ashbury (sanctus bell), South Leigh (raising guide frame), Little Horwood (rehanging), Aylesbury Holy Trinity (current situation), Daylesford (current situation), Hanslope (Bell Fund inspection), Great Tew (Bell Fund inspection), Dorchester Abbey (TMA), Hampstead Norreys (Bell Fund grant inspection) and Piddington (advice). There have also been many "return to ringing" inspections.

We continue to run the Tower Maintenance Award (TMA) scheme and towers are encouraged to join in. Inspections are free and there is much to be gained from the inspection and the advice you may receive. Please get in touch if you would like a visit. The current TMA awards are listed in this report.

TOWER MAINTENANCE AWARD SCHEME 2020

It has been rather a long time since we prepared a report on the scheme so that there are rather more changes to report than would normally be the case. In addition, because of Covid and the effects of lockdown, the T & B committee has decided that the renewal date for all awards due for renewal in 2020 will be extended for one year. Since the last report, the activity in the Tower Maintenance Award Scheme has remained steady with the number of current awards still at seventeen. The number of towers participating or expressing an interest is ninety-three, which is about twenty-one per cent of the four hundred and forty towers listed in the annual report last year. There have now been one hundred and sixty-six inspections (of which twenty-six were preliminaries), resulting in one hundred and twenty awards (ninety-three Gold, twenty-eight Silver, and fifteen Bronze).

The number of expired awards has risen again and is now thirty-two. The T & B committee continues to contact the expired towers with the aim of persuading them to renew their awards. Since the last report fourteen towers have renewed Gold Awards while Wardington has gained a Gold Award and Cuddesden and Penn Silver Awards at the first attempt: congratulations to all these towers. Awards for seven towers have expired since the last report (see the "Expired Awards" list and it is hoped that they will attempt to renew (or improve) their awards.

The number of Branches having a tower in the "current awards" list is now nine out of the fifteen Guild Branches, with EBSB having regained its predominant position, being just in front of the Reading Branch (in the last report it was the other way round!). The placings are as follows:

PEAL SECRETARY'S REPORT FOR 2020

A total of 86 peals was rung for the Guild in 2020 (185 less than in 2019): 59 on handbells and 27 on tower bells. These reductions reflect the national situation with restrictions and lockdown because of the coronavirus pandemic. This again puts the Guild second in terms of the highest-ranking Guild/Association for the total number of peals rung during the year. The Guild was also in second position for the number of handbell peals rung. One member rang their first peal and one member their first in hand. Congratulations to them and to John Wells on ringing his 2000th peal. A summary of the leading peal ringers and their personal achievements can be seen below.

The leading tower was Hughenden with 4 peals, and the leading handbell venue was Tilehurst, 15 Lytham End with 27 peals.

ANALYSIS OF QUARTER PEALS RUNG DURING 2020

Surprise: Cambridge

This analysis considers QPs posted on BellBoard at <u>http://bb.ringingworld.co.uk/</u>, rung between 1st January 2019 and 31st December 2020 in Berkshire, Buckinghamshire or Oxfordshire, or at an external venue specifying the ODG.

The impact of the Covid-19 pandemic reduced quarter peal activity within the guild by about 50% during 2020. At least 588 QPs were rung either within the ODG boundaries or for the Guild at external towers. Tower bell QPs within the guild were reduced by about 75% to 253 tower bell QPs within the guild at about half as many towers, 110 towers, plus 12 QPs at eleven external towers. Hand bell QPs increased by about 50% to 335, with the number of venues also increasing by 50% to 45. Nearly 57% of all QPs were rung in hand, an almost exponential rate of increase in the fraction of hand bell QPs, which had already doubled in 2019. A significant facilitator of this effect was the continued enthusiasm of members of the Badgers Handbell who found themselves well placed to welcome tower bell ringers seeking an alternative outlet for their ringing energy when it became unsafe to ring tower bell QPs.

The rise of virtual platforms for bell ringing, in conjunction with communication channels such as Zoom, has been embraced by many of us as a sociable and enjoyable learning tool at all levels, while many others derive no pleasure from pressing a key to "ring a bell". Action controllers such as the eBells developed by Graham John and friends provide a satisfying and popular alternative, particularly when used with Graham's Handbell Stadium to provide an effective simulation of ringing hand bells in person with other ringers. Distributed performances were a significant feature of ringing in 2020. Although it is difficult to accurately quantify the number of virtual QPs rung by members of the guild, at least 190 (20%) of the nearly 1000 virtual QPs posted on Bellboard during 2020 included at least one member of the ODG. About 80% of virtual QPs used Ringing Room, both within the ODG and internationally, with other platforms including Ding, ReBel and Muster. Simon Head rang in over half of the QPs using Ding in 2020, which were exclusively tower bell QPs. Over 80% of virtual QPs rung by members of the ODG were "in hand", with likely contributing factors being an increased likelihood of technical issues with more ringers controlling one bell each, and increased ease of establishing a good rhythm between fewer ringers controlling two bells each.

Except where specified, the figures in this report refer to QPs rung in person.

Venues: Tower bell QP ringing was permitted for less than ten weeks during 2020, so the well done to the two towers, Old Marston and Bletchingdon, that made it into double figures, hosting 11 and 10 QPs, respectively. Four towers scored 9 QPs each (Freeland, Longcot, Reading St Laurence and Tilehurst.

The most prolific hand bell QP venue was Grandpont Nature Park within the Oxford City Branch, where 57 QPs were achieved, followed by 26 Redlands Road, Reading where 38 QPs were rung in hand, and 26 Sedgewell Road, a new venue in the Sonning Deanery where the Ellis family were very productive in ringing 34 QPs. 32 QPs were rung in hand at The White House (Aston Rowant, South Oxon Branch), with five further hand bell venues hosting between 15 and 24 QPs (2 Murdoch Road, Wokinham (24 QPs), 40 Western Road, Oxford (22 QPs), 2 Long Close, Oxford (21 QPs), 15 Lytham End, Tilehurst (17 QPs) and 4 St Denys Close, Stanford in the Vale (15 QPs).

Oxford City Branch therefore remained the most productive branch for hand bell as well as tower bell QPs in 20120, scoring 44 in the tower and 118 in hand, a total of 162, followed by Reading Branch (29 tower bell QPs, 68 hand bell QPs). EBSB was the third most prolific branch for tower bell QPs (24) and Sonning Deanery for hand bell QPs (65).

Congratulations to numerous ringers who expanded their QP boundaries in 2020. Special congratulations go to the nine first quarter pealers (plus two whose first QPs were on virtual platforms), two ringers who scored their first QP inside, two new QP conductors, and particularly to

Dominic Ellis, age 9, who managed all three firsts in 2020. Apologies to any I have omitted from the lists below.

Ringing milestones achieved during 2020 included: Joe Norton (1000th QP), John Pusey (950th QP), Elizabeth A Smith, David L Thomas (700th QP, 400th as C, 100th in hand as C), Alison Merryweather-Clarke (800th QP), Barry J Davis (750th QP), Graham J Clifton (600th as C), Jonathan Mills, Craig Robertson (300th QP), Barry J Davis (150th QP on Banbury bells), Lisa Ryan (150th QP), Adam D Rebick (100th QP), John A Harrison (100th in hand). Two pairs of ringers, Lindsay Powell and Joe Norton, and Alison Merryweather-Clarke and Neil Ephgrave, rang their 300th QP together, Alison Merryweather-Clarke and Julie Minch rang their 200th QP together, and the following pairs of ringers celebrated their 100th QP together: David L Thomas and Joe Norton; David L Thomas and Lindsay Powell; David L Thomas and Craig Robertson; Lindsay Powell and Dave Endacott; Mike Winterbourne and Mark Robins; and Alison Merryweather-Clarke and Sue Rhodes. Alison Merryweather-Clarke counted Adam D Rebick as the 500th different person with whom she had rung a QP in person.

Breakdown of Quarter Peals: The table shows the number of QPs rung, divided by stage, branch and type of bell. The increased proportion of hand bell QPs has again tipped the scales further in favour of even numbered stages; 34% of QPs in person were Major (19% of tower bell QPs and 46% of hand bell QPs), 29% were Minor (27% of tower bell QPs and 31% of hand bell QPs), 11% were Royal (5% of tower bell QPs and 15% of hand bell QPs), while only 13% were Doubles (28% of tower bell QPs and 1% of hand bell QPs), a remarkable shift considering about a third of all QPs rung in the guild between 2015 and 2018 were doubles.

Almost a third of the 588 ODG QPs rung in person in 2020 were of Plain Bob (193 QPs: 6 Minimus, 19 Doubles, 74 Minor, 7 Triples, 69 Major, 1 Caters, 17 Royal). Kent Treble Bob (49 QPs: 9 Minor, 25 Major, 15 Royal) was the next most popular method, relegating Grandsire to third place (39 QPs: 15 Doubles, 18 Triples, 1 Major, 5 Caters), closely followed by Cambridge (36 QPs: 22 Minor, 4 Major, 6 Royal, 4 Maximus) and Yorkshire (35 QPs: 33 Major, 2 Royal). Stedman (19 QPs: 17 Triples, 2 Cinques), Little Bob (10 QPs: 3 Major, 7 Royal) and St Clements College Bob (10 QPs: 5 Minor, 1 Triples, 4 Major) were also significant choices, with two of the Stedman Triples QPs being in hand, at Aston Rowant.

The most methods rung in a multi-method QP was down to 11 in 2020, in one QP of spliced Royal (at St Thomas' Oxford, the most major for Katherine Stonham and Craig Robertson) and four Doubles QPs, one of these in hand at Grandpont, a first for all the band.

QPs were rung in person in the guild on 206 days during 2020, and including the use of virtual platforms, on 275 days, a reduction of 119 and 50 days, respectively, compared with 2019. As a sign of the times, only one QP was rung on St George's Day; Graham John conducted a band, otherwise

external to the guild, ringing Bristol Surprise Major in Handbell Stadium. This was one of only five QPs posted on BellBoard for 23rd April, the others being plain minor and major. Predictably, the most prolific months for QPs in the Guild were January and February. February's total of 123 QPs would have been sufficient to gain second place last year, showing that at least we got off to a good start in 2020. Sunday remained the most popular day on which to ring a QP, although the proportion of QPs rung on a Sunday decreased from 33% to 25% in this unusual year. Two hand bell QPs were rung for Sunday service in December, one by the innovative Page 3 Society at the Minster Church of St Mary the Virgin in Reading, and one at the High Altar of St Michael's Church in Tilehurst conducted by Colin Newman with Joanne Druce and Giles Winter. Sadly, no QPs could be rung on Palm Sunday or Easter Sunday which were two of only eight Sundays on which no QPs were recorded on any platform, and a single QP was rung in the guild on Remembrance Sunday, in hand by the Ellis family when Louise and Dominic rang new pairs, 3-4 and 7-8, respectively, to Plain Bob Major. The most fruitful day for QPs in 2020 was Saturday August 22nd, which, true to form, appears to have been a socially distanced QP day at 26 Redlands Road where 14 QPs were rung in hand (including London No. 3 Surprise Royal and Grandsire Caters), coinciding with a further two QPs at Grandpont Nature Reserve. The next fourteen most prolific days were all on or before Sunday March 15th, mostly Sundays, with the notable exception of Saturday February 29th when 12 QPs were rung celebrating leap day, coinciding with Brian Baldwin's 81st birthday and Newbury Branch QP week when Chris Pack took his first leap into Stedman Caters, and Martha Hazell did the same with Stedman Triples in another corner of the guild.

QPs in memoriam for ringers who died in 2020 remembered Di Bridle, Jean Butler, Ronald Diserens, Geoffrey K Dodd, Derek Fowles, Garth Porter, Sandra Robinson, Stanley G Scott and John S White, Amongst those able to incorporate ringing of some form into their significant birthday celebrations were Anna E Sherwood (20th), Rebecca Gingell (30th, scoring the first cinques QP on the Ringing Room platform), John Hearn (50th), James Champion (60th), Jo Gamester and Elizabeth A Smith (both 70th; with impeccable timing, Liz celebrated with her 700th QP), and Ralph Elmes (80th).

In a difficult year, many ODG ringers have adapted well to change and developed new skills. Teamwork and mentorship between members of different branches has continued, becoming even more evident on virtual platforms. It is to be hoped that the rise in popularity of hand bells, and new methods learned in ringing room, will translate into increased understanding and ability with improved counting and striking in the tower when we have the opportunity, and that our communities will be pleased to hear their bells again.

In the meantime, I will give the last word to the Badgers Handbell Ringers who finished 2020 by ringing a new method and appropriately naming it Good Riddance 2020 Bob Minor.

Public benefit

The fund's object of raising and collecting sums of money and to applying the income arising from the investment of such sums in or towards the repair and renewal of church bells in the Diocese of Oxford has been met during the year as detailed in the paragraphs below, and by raising awareness of the Charity within the Churches of the Oxford Diocese.

Across the Diocese, the public benefits from the preservation of a unique tradition and heritage. Local communities will be able to hear the bells ring for Divine Service, for weddings and on other occasions, and members of the public are able to participate in an inclusive activity that benefits them both physically and mentally.

Fund Raising

The year started very positively with the transfer of the ODG Restoration Fund Assets into the Oxford Diocesan Bell Fund. There were 4 outstanding provisional Grants at the point of transfer; Broadwell (\pounds 1,200); Lt Horwood (\pounds 860); Hanslope (\pounds 220) and Chinnor (\pounds 185). During the year the provisional grant to Chinnor expired and Hanslope grant was paid. The remaining 2 projects are in progress and expected to complete in 2021. The Restricted Fund held for the Longworth Project (\pounds 14,586) was transferred to the Bell Fund.

The sponsored Quarter Peal Week in February was very successful.

In March the Country was severely affected by the Covid 19 Pandemic. Most churches were closed and ringing suspended. When ringing restarted in September, it was restricted by social distancing measures, and limited to 15 minutes duration. In many towers only a single bell could be rung for Services. A second lock-down became necessary in December, which brought further Church closures and more ringing restrictions. Work on developing and licencing vaccines, brought new hope at the end of the year, but it seems unlikely that ringing restrictions can be eased much before June or July. The Trustees met twice during 2020, once in person and once by Zoom.

New money raised in 2020 amounted to £11,688 (2019; £10,013), which includes £3741 from the Leap Year Quarter Peal Week. Regular fund raising included £3999 from Branch donations; £215 from towers; pledge giving £422; donations from PCCs £215; and the Guild donated £2000. A tax refund on Gift Aid Donations of £1,048 was received. £14,721 was transferred to the Bell Fund from the ODG Restoration Fund upon its closure.

The Managing Trustees would like to thank all who have contributed to the continued success of the Fund

Grants

During the year, new applications were received and provisional grants allocated: Steeple aston (£790) Tilehurst (£10,000) Broadwell (£1000)

Grants were paid during the year towards eligible work at: Letcombe Bassett Hanslope Great Tew

In accordance with the Trustees' policy, an independent assessment of completion of work is undertaken before a grant is paid. Members of the Towers and Belfries Committee carry out these inspections on the Fund's behalf. The Managing Trustees wish to record their gratitude for this service.

During the year the Managing Trustees maintained the level of provisional grant allocations at 20% of the estimated costs of eligible work. If the final cost is materially different from the indicated cost at the time of application, the grant is reviewed and may be revised. The level of grant allocated depends on the number of applications and the income available and so may vary from year to year.

Investments

Investment income for the year was £23,850 (2019: £25,341).

The new money raised has been invested on a regular basis in accordance with advice received from the Diocesan Financial Advisor. Transactions are made on behalf of the Fund by the Diocesan authorities. Money is invested in a number of different charitable investments and these include:

The market value of the investments at 31st December 2020 was £853,149 (2019: £788,604).

Following a very useful branch committee meeting at the end of 2019, the Central Bucks Branch started 2020 in good heart. Several new initiatives were introduced in January at the request of members. Like everywhere, we managed two meetings at the start of 2020 and then had to give up just days before our 2020 AGM was due to be held in March. Eventaully we had a successful AGM in October, our first Zoom meeting thanks to Mark Instone for arranging it and for moderating the meeting so that everyone could join in easily. Also in the meeting was Catherine Lane, ODG Master and we were pleased she joined us. All the Officers were re-elected. However, Philip Dobson asked for someone else to take over as Chairman next year to take the Branch forward and Roy Woodruff wanted someone to take over as Treasurer. We are a small Branch and have been very successful in the past 5 years with everyone collaborating well, however without people willing to help with our organisation we will falter....

The Branch lost two longstanding members in the year: John White in March who was previously a ringer at Aston Clinton together with his family and more recently he was a ringer at Drayton St Leonard and also a former Deputy Master of the Guild; Roger Hazell of Aston Clinton who had previously rung at Hughenden and died in August.

We have a very successful 100 Club which raises considerable sums for the branch and the Guild restoration funds but the monthly draws stopped from March since meetings were not being held. There was discussion at the AGM of several ways of dealing with the unallocated funds in a fair manner. It was finally agreed to hold a bumper Christmas draw this year with more winners and bigger prizes and recommence the monthly draws in March 2021.

In October just over half of our towers were doing some ringing, mainly on Sundays, which was good to know, although ringing is currently severely curtailed once again. Some towers did not restart because of lack of room or ventilation and some towers are keeping in touch with their ringers via emails, What's App or outdoor socialising. No ringers have said they were giving up. Some towers had rung for VJ Day and for a wedding or funeral. Very few individuals have tried ringing via Ringing Room or similar. Maybe your tower might at least ring 1 or 2 bells occasionally to remind local residents that the bells and church do exist.

Slapton Restoration - Slapton reported in October that they now had sufficient funds raised to proceed with the restoration of their existing 5 bells (ie not to augment to 6 as had been their original intention when the project was first proposed several years ago), although it is not known when the project

will actually start. The branch is delighted that Slapton's project is finally going to proceed and agreed to grant Slapton an additional \pounds 500, to be paid on or near completion of their project together with the branch's original grant \pounds 1,000 already offered. We look forward to helping Slapton get back to ringing when the project is completed.

At the AGM a paper with observations on measures of success with regard to the "health" of branches written by Mark Instone was discussed. The various villages in the Chiltern area have a generally mature population with relatively few young people. The branch should not compare itself unfavourably with other branches or large towns that have bands ringing advanced methods on 10 or 12 bells or that seek to focus more on teaching activities for young people and often involving technology based learning and fast results. Older learners are just as valuable and can be very loyal tower members. The meeting thanked Mark for his astute conclusions and agreed with them, noting that the Zoom platform made it difficult for everyone easily to discuss what measures we can hope to implement once ringing gets back to a more normal environment. We would need to revisit this again in due course.

We now have another lockdown. Like everyone, we hope that our members and their families are keeping safe and well and send our good wishes to everyone affected by coronavirus.

2020 started much as any other year. A programme of practices had been arranged and diary cards distributed to members. A Training Practice, two Branch Practices and a Surprise Practice were run successfully but then Covid-19 struck the country and all further ringing after mid-March was cancelled due to lockdown. No more service ringing, practices, striking contests, meetings, social events, etc.

The February Leap Year ringing came before the pandemic. Nine towers supported this, donating $\pounds 819$ ($\pounds 946.25$ with gift aid) to the Oxford Diocesan Bell Fund. Four quarter peals and one peal were completed for the cause. At the Tower Captains' meeting in February, we discussed training needs, communication, public relations and safeguarding. There was a general air of positivity and the wish to increase and improve our efforts, but we have been unable to take ideas forward.

Our AGM, which should have been in April, eventually took place in October using Zoom. Only 22 members (plus the Guild Master) attended, but this is fairly typical for AGM's in recent years. All officers (apart from Josie Godfrey as one of the Young Ringers Organisers) agreed to continue and were re-elected. Matthew Johnson was also elected as our new Ringing Master. Despite there being

very little ringing this year five new members were elected and two re-elected at the AGM, adding to the 13 elected and six re-elected at the January meeting. Our total membership remains stable at 322. With few sales opportunities, the Fund Raising Committee was only able to donate £400 to the Oxford Diocesan Bell Fund. There was an additional £650 from the 100 Club, but that was suspended in September until ringing resumes.

Sadly a few of our more senior members passed away during the year. Angela Blundell, Derek Fowles, Myles Hawkins, Graham Jones and Joyce Pearson all served their local churches not only as bellringers but in many other ways and will be greatly missed. Special mention should be made of Derek Fowles. He was active at Guild level and as Tower Captain, Deputy Tower Captain, Steeple Keeper and Treasurer at Bray over many years, and was the Branch Ringing Master, Treasurer (1982 to 2003), and Chairman and Treasurer of the Branch Fund Raising Committee. We are most grateful for Derek's contribution to bellringing.

Fortunately, most bands have been keeping in touch with each other during lockdown and there was limited ringing at many towers during the summer. Some have also been using Ringing Room. We hope that most ringers will return to tower bell ringing when we are allowed to and that 2021 will be a better year for everyone.

The first quarter of the year was almost normal with a full program for the year and positive objectives for taking part in all three of the Guild Striking Competitions. The Branch AGM was held on Saturday 7th March at Emberton. The usual and much-loved routines of pre meeting ringing, a Service, the meeting followed by an excellent tea were enjoyed by representatives of 16 towers. The only hint of changes ahead was the odd restriction of not shaking hands. The AGM turned out to be

the last formal event of the year and the lockdown in the middle of March changed our ringing world almost completely.

Very limited ringing has taken place since the original lockdown with many churches not having services for long periods and at the time of writing this report no services are taking place in most North Bucks churches. The restrictions of social distancing, ventilation issues, limited services, time constraints and the personal safety of individuals have only been eased in a limited number of towers where adequate space exists and where family groups have made some ringing possible. The following is a summary of Towers that have been ringing when live services have taken place. A few bells: Great Linford (5-6 bells), Newport Pagnell (4 bells), Bletchley (3 bells), Downs Barn (5-6 bells), Shenley (4 bells) Fortnightly, Emberton (3 bells), Loughton (2 bells), Lillington Lovell (5 bells), Old Bradwell (3 bells). Just one bell: Woughton on the Green, Olney, Simpson, Leckhampstead, Great Brickhill, Maids Moreton and No ringing: Stowe, Hanslope, Buckingham, Fenny Stratford, Sherington, Whaddon, Old Wolverton, Wavendon, Shalstone, Stony Stratford, Calverton.

One tower, **Hanslope** has been busy with great results and equal measures of frustration. Hanslope bells were taken down from the tower by White's of Appleton in August 2019, and they were put into the church to enable people to come in and see them. They had a" Goodbye to the Bells" evening which was extremely well supported and raised several thousand pounds. White's then collected the bells and began working on them at their premises, with a planned return date to Hanslope of December 2019 / January 2020. However, after removing the headstocks they discovered that the 7th and tenor bells had too many holes in the crown so they had to be sent away for welding and then redrilled. There was also a delay due to a backlog of work at the company where the frame was being cast. By now it was March 2020 and the start of coronavirus pandemic which impacted further on the work schedule at White's.

The bells were eventually returned to Hanslope in August 2020 and once again were put on display in the church for people to view them, but under very controlled conditions due to the imposed restrictions of the virus, and they were unable to hold the envisaged big fundraising event to welcome the bells back to the church. In the event, there was a very lowkey Service of Dedication of the Bells, with a small and socially distanced congregation. The following week White's returned to put the bells back up into the tower, and over the next few weeks they completed the installation which was not made easy for them with all the Covid restrictions, and this also prevented them from ringing all eight bells together to try them out.

The bells were finally inspected and signed off in October 2020, over a year after work had commenced on the bells, and this enabled the Hanslope Restoration Project to receive the money from the various grants that had been secured. So as of January 2021, there has been no ringing at Hanslope for seventeen months. A plan to ring for the first time on Remembrance Sunday was prevented by the second lockdown, and a similar plan for Christmas morning was thwarted by the third lockdown. They are now hoping to be able to ring them at Easter. As a result of the extra work required on the bells and an increase in the cost of the building work, there is still an amount of $\pounds 8,000$ outstanding and no prospect of being able to hold any money raising events for some time to come.

This is an appropriate point to close a report on a very difficult 2020.

When ringing stopped last March, Reading Branch shrugged it shoulders thinking it would be back to pulling ropes in no time. Some towers such as Checkendon, Henley, Whitchurch St Mary's and St Laurence in Reading have not had any ringing at all. However, several towers have managed socially distanced ringing when allowed. How many of us, though, would have learned how to video conference or to use Ringing Room if not given the impetus to do so?

Tilehurst has used ringing room since April and arrange practices regularly, sometimes daily, depending on availability. Service ringing resumed on 21st July and continued until November; this was normally on five bells: 1, 3, 5, 7, 8. Handbells were rung in the churchyard on 12th and 19th July prior to service and a quarter peal in hand was rung in the sanctuary of the church on 13th December. The tower has regular weekly virtual pub sessions instead of practice nights!

At Swallowfield, when restrictions were eased, there have been a couple of occasions to ring at Sunday service on three bells, (or on one occasion, four bells as two ringers were in their own social bubble). A couple of tower inspections have been done to ensure that the bells were still fine and are no major issues were reported. The members had several social events, including a Christmas mincepies and mulled wine zoom meeting and have managed to keep Ringing Room meetings going twice a week throughout lockdown - with some assistance from Eversley and Shinfield towers. Starting very hesitantly with plain bob doubles, there has been gradual progression to surprise minor and now regularly London, Beverley, Surfleet, Cambridge, Primrose, York, Ipswich and Norwich are rung. If enough ringers log in the practice can include to 8-bell methods including half-courses of Yorkshire and Cambridge Major. Tom Blomley has taken up hand-bell ringing and kindly assisted by Nigel Mellor (All Saints Wokingham) he now has motion sensors and has been able to ring 1-2, 3-4 and 5-6 positions for Plain Bob Minor, using Handbell Stadium.

Nettlebed opted to ring handbells for the short ceremony at the war memorial in the lych gate to commemorate VJ day in August. James Champion, one of our regular ringers, suggested that handbells would sound better than "3 Blind Mice" on tower bells and he was kind enough to ask the Ellis family to help with this. They rang for about 10 minutes in the Churchyard after the prayers, and then repaired to a large garage to ring a quarter peal, with the doors wide open for social distancing.

There was limited service ringing at the Minster in Reading when restrictions were lifted during the summer; also social bubble handbells were rung outside the Minster at Sunday services when these took place, virtual coffee and then ongoing ringing room practices have been well attended. St Giles, Reading managed regular ringing on 4 bells during the autumn whenever allowed. The Barrett family, Chris, Sara, Joseph and Daniel, ensured that there was service ringing on Christmas day. At Goring there was 6 bell ringing for a wedding in the summer only enabled as all the ringers were members of the same family.

At Shiplake any ringing outside of lockdown periods has been restricted to 3 bells (or 4 bells when 2 family were members involved). Christmas Day was marked by service ringing. During lockdown 1 bell is rung for 15 mins before on-line broadcast services and this has included several funerals. All our normal Sunday ringers have had a ring during these sessions except one who was unfortunate enough to fall and break her arm and is not yet fit enough to resume ringing. There has been a Ringing Room practice each Tuesday evening, primarily for the one young ringer Daisy who was just at the point of starting plain hunt on 4 when the restrictions began. The members have only been able to do this with the help of friends from Wargrave, Sonning and Wallingford. On RR Daisy is now ringing PB Major inside, treble bob hunt on 6 and Kent TB Minor inside. She rang the treble to a QP of Grandsire Triples on RR just before Christmas, her first ever QP, which was a great achievement. The practice night band also attempt a QP on RR each week, so far we have rung QPs of Grandsire Triples, Cambridge, Bourne and Ipswich S Minor and Oxford TB Minor. Participants suffered their fair share of technical problems, primarily delays to one or more bells and screen obliterations by pop up messages, but with the help of our friends we have been able to keep things going with RR until the day when we can return to the tower.

Reading Branch has begun to run Ringing Practices to replace the normal monthly Branch practice particularly for members whose towers do not run these sessions.

At the AGM on 15th February in Finchampstead, 20 new members were elected to the Guild. All Branch Officers remained in post except for the Branch Secretary, and Jan Glen was elected to that role. Jane Mellor was elected as Training Officer.

All scheduled branch practices went ahead until lockdown in the middle of March. This included the new Elementary practice introduced in 2019. This practice is very well supported by both learners and helpers and the learners are making good progress. Young Ringers practices, fitted in before lockdown, were well supported with steady improvement in the ringing ability of the more experienced YRs: Little Bob, Kent, Stedman, Cambridge Surprise Minor, and Cambridge Surprise Major. Eleven Sonning Tower members, plus two from Henley and two from Eversley managed to fit in an outing before lockdown and visited 4 towers in the area between Camberley, Basingstoke and Reading - Holy Trinity at Hawley (8), St Mary, Eversley (6), St Michael, Heckfield (5), and All Saints, Swallowfield (6).

Several Sonning Deanery Branch ringers have been progressing in the Learning the Ropes programme. In January Elizabeth Sutcliffe of Wargrave (Loddon Hub) and Jamal Khan of Warfield passed Level 1, and Tabitha Mills of Wargrave achieved Level 2.

Prior to the lockdown on Nov 5th, three quarters of our towers reported ringing in some form during Covid-19 restrictions: 8 towers rang on Sundays and 7 use RingingRoom.com weekly. Most towers only ring 3 or 4 bells each Sunday for 15 minutes with ringers participating on a rota. Social distancing, family bubbles, masks, hand sanitiser and ventilation all feature. Many towers have had significant success with RingingRoom.com although the technology has defeated some. Zoom, Discord and Skype are used for audio. Learners have progressed their method ringing relatively quickly when they don't have a tower bell to control as well! Several have progressed from Plain Hunt to ringing inside and some from plain methods to surprise minor.

Some towers have held socially distanced handbell practices and quarter peals outside, plus online ringing using Handbell Stadium. One member, Nigel Mellor, even made his own motion sensors using wallpaper scrappers.

It is hard to believe that it is now over one year since ringing stopped for most towers across our branch. A few towers have rung three and four bells, whilst others have chimed or not rung at all. On the social side, several towers, notably Ducklington, have kept regular online contact going with their weekly Zoom "virtual pub" meetings, joined by our friends Hannah and Peter from Australia.

In April, the branch sadly lost one of its longest serving ringers. Terence Rouse passed away at home surrounded by his family at the age of 85. Terry's father taught him to ring at the age of 11 so we know he was a ringer for over 70 years, having served as Bampton Vice Tower Captain for over 40 years. Later in the year, our good wishes went with Chris Moxon on his move back to Yorkshire, accompanied by anticipation of a Witney & Woodstock branch outing to God's Own County when current restrictions are a distant memory! Chris was a major factor in reviving Treble Bob ringing across the branch and was a great source of knowledge for the new ringers across the branch, sometimes ringing five nights a week. We shall miss his commitment and enthusiasm in the tower.

Thanks to the remarkable internet browser-based Ringing Room, Chris is still able to join our virtual practice nights. Ringing room has enabled many of our beginners to make great strides in their understanding of methods and bellringing theory. Many local ringers have enjoyed the benefits of virtual ringing, be it in focused sessions introducing them to ringing room, or regular late-night sessions with ringers' way above their pay grade, some of whom come from other branches of the ODG, some from other continents. Some grasped the concept of counting places for the first time and progressed from tentative plain hunt in the tower to ringing virtual affected touches of bob doubles and bob minor. Still others have consolidated surprise minor and taken their first steps into

surprise major methods, progress that would have been unlikely to have been as rapid had the need to gather living ringers been required! Of course, it remains to be seen if skills acquired over the internet can be translated into competent handling in the tower, but the virtue of ringing room is all about accelerated opportunities to learn the work in a supportive environment.

Another unexpected benefit of lockdown was the motivation it provided to Alison Merryweather-Clarke, Lorna Curtis, Andrew Goldthorpe, Marysia Hermaszewska and Toby Goss amongst others to learn handbells. Grateful for the support of Roger Barnes and evangelical handbell ringers in Oxford City, ONB and VOWH branches, progress has been made varying from plain hunt minor to Little Bob Royal for Alison! Alison has been joined by four other handbell novices and beginners in regular handbell practices in North Leigh, providing entertainment to passers-by on the village green! Toby Goss rang his first course of bob minor in hand with Alison and Lorna Curtis, possibly the first in hand in the branch this millennium, but hopefully the first of many.

Finally, the branch would like to offer its thanks to members of ART, the ODG and CCCBR for their painstaking negotiations with the Church of England and PHE regarding returning to ringing. I am sure we all hope to return to our towers sooner rather than later. Who knows, with so many people adopting new working practices from home, desperate to escape their four walls, there may even be an exciting opportunity to attract new ringers!
